The Stoller Hall is directly opposite Manchester Victoria Station, within easy reach of all main train, bus, tram and road links.

Visitor access is via Hunt's Bank, with the main entrance directly facing Manchester Arena. The Carole Nash Hall and Oglesby Atrium are also accessed via the Hunt's Bank entrance.





PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Taxi and Drop-Off: All vehicles are able to come up from Victoria Street, up Hunts Bank and along Victoria Station Approach (it is a one way system). There are some disabled parking spaces outside Victoria Station, and although these can be in high demand, they are a useful drop-off location.

It is also possible for taxis to go from Victoria Station Approach down to Victoria Street, and taxis can drop off directly outside the Hunts Bank entrance.

By Train: The Stoller Hall is directly opposite Manchester Victoria Station where train services run from across the region. Manchester Victoria Station is also a 10-minute direct tram journey from Manchester Piccadilly.

By Tram: The nearest stop to The Stoller Hall is Victoria Station. Exchange Square is also only a short walk away.

By Bus: Many buses stop a few minutes' walk from The Stoller Hall, on Corporation Street and at Shudehill Transport Interchange. The central bus station at Piccadilly Gardens and the coach station on Chorlton Street are each a 10-15 minute walk or a short tram ride away.

PARKING

The nearest car park is Q-Park Deansgate North (M3 7WJ – this is an indoor multi-storey car park, open 24/7. You can park for £5 for up to 8 hours by collecting a discount voucher from box office, which you can use as you exit the car park (card payments only).

Q-Park Deansgate North has 23 disabled spaces and 4 electric car-charging points. The journey from the car park to The Stoller Hall (via Victoria Street) is approximately 400m, up a relatively steep incline. This incline can be avoided by a slightly longer walk past Manchester Cathedral and the Football Museum.

There are anti-speed barriers across the car park entrance that can make the car park look closed, but these barriers will lift when you drive slowly towards them.

Whilst there are other car parks nearby (including NCPs Manchester Deansgate and Manchester Park Street and CitiPark Manchester Arena), we are not able to offer any discounted parking at these.
